It's a fair COPP, growing fairer

WHEN tbc minister Laurie Burn left a village church in rural East Devon in August 2006, it was quite a culture shock to come to the city. In fact he had once said: "If God wants me to come to a city, he will have to use a megaphone!"

But the parks and green spaces of South Bristol provide a small taste of the country in the heart of the city.

Our local park, Perrett's Park was one of the venues for the Love Bristol community action week in July 2006, when groups of young Christian volunteers helped restore benches and clean up the park. Following on from this, Laurie found that several other groups and individuals were concerned about

the park, but there was no co-ordinated group or strategy. So, in February 2007 residents were invited to a meeting at tbc to gauge local interest.

After a survey of 900 homes, 30 volunteers turned up for an action day in April when benches were renovated and litter cleared. COPP - The Community of Perrett's Park - was born and has since organised bulb-planting, a Picnic in the Park, Carols in the Park and other events.

In September, COPP won a Certificate of Merit in the Bristol in Bloom Awards, and has recently won a bid for £2,000 worth of roses.

The next event will be an Easter Egg Hunt on Sunday, March 23, starting at 3pm.

Life takes Debra from atheism and break-up to baptism and trust

DEBRA Atkins came to Bristol to find love, but she got more than she bargained for. When a close relationship suddenly broke up, she moved to Totterdown, along with Scooby, her enormous bloodhound cross, to start a new

Desperately searching for some meaning in her life, several 'chance' encounters with Christians, including meeting fellow dog-walker, tbc minister, Laurie Burn in Perrett's Park, led Debra to the church and a flat to live in.

Her father was an atheist and forbade her to attend religious instruction, but

Debra's grandmother taught her to pray.

In the next 40 years, she had several inexplicable spiritual experiences and visions which left her with more questions than answers, but an urge to attend a service during a lonely holiday in Greece was thwarted when Debra was shooed away by a priest who established she was neither Catholic nor Orthodox!

At tbc however, she found a community of people who shared her spiritual journey and who are finding life's questions answered in the person of Jesus. Here she found a warm welcome and understanding friends. She also discovered a personal relationship with the risen Lord Jesus Christ.

When Debra learned that tbc was holding a service of believer's Baptism last October, she decided to be baptised as a public statement of her faith and a sign of

her decision to lead a new life with Jesus beside her. That morning, Debra said: "My relationship with God is central in my life and I'm thankful for all the friends and scholars who have... given me time and space and pointers to help me begin to understand it."

Who or what is tbc?

tbc is the group of people which meets in the building known as Totterdown Baptist Church. Our vision and purpose are summed up: Being God's family,

helping people to know Jesus. tbc meets every Sunday at 10.30am and 6.30pm, plus midweek meetings.

"WHAT about suffering?" "Is there life after death?" These are two questions which most people ask, and many books have tried to answer

And yet his response was one of love and forgiveness. In those intense hours, God himself felt the full pain of the world's suffering.

As to the question of life after death, when the women went to tend his dead body on the Sunday morning, the grave was empty, and Jesus proved that he truly is the Risen Son of God with just one word: "Mary!"
