## <u>Totterdown Baptist Church Risk Assessments – Jan 2024, to be reviewed Jan 2025</u>

#### **General comments**

#### Slips and trips

One of the most significant hazards in this type of premises is linked to slips, trips and falls. This is also the second most common accident that occurs in UK workplaces.

Floor cleaning is scheduled at times when the numbers of public in the buildings is limited. Staff and volunteers are trained to dry floors after cleaning and to make good use of the slippery floor warning signage. (*Including outside ramps/steps*)

Staff and volunteers are trained to be vigilant to maintain good standards of housekeeping to minimise the risk of tripping. Carpets and rugs are also checked as part of the monthly inspection to ensure that they do not pose a risk. Walkways are required to be kept clear at all times. During cleaning and maintenance activities, items of equipment and cables are positioned so as not to obstruct the walkways and working areas. Steps should be taken to ensure that trailing leads are kept to a minimum.

External areas are provided with adequate levels of lighting to ensure safe access and egress to the premises during periods of darkness.

#### Electrical appliances

There is a programme for both portable appliance inspections and fixed installation inspections in accordance with HSE and BS 7671: 2001 guidelines. Inspection certificates and records retained in Vestry. Portable items are visually inspected by users prior to their use. Defective equipment reported and removed from service. Work is undertaken by competent electricians in accordance with IEE requirements

#### Working at height

Ladders and stepladders are provided to be used for access to high levels on a very occasional basis. Prolonged working at height or work that requires hazardous activities will be contracted to specialist organisations. Scaffolding tower provided when working at height for prolonged durations. Never work alone - always accompanied. Do not over-reach. Only perform activities that can be carried out single handedly. Make sure nobody is below/around working area. Carry all items, e.g. light bulbs, securely.

### <u>Food</u>

Pre-prepared food is often brought in to the church premises (e.g. for bring-and-share lunches).

Usual food hygiene practices to be followed.

Allergy details labelled on food. Individual responsibility for checking that it is safe for them to eat. In the event that the Church is made aware of severe intolerances, additional control measures may need to be implemented (e.g. a ban of nuts on the premises).

Food should also be stored in sealed containers. Any containers not kept in cupboards or the fridge should be kept in plastic/metal containers so that they do not become an accessible food source for rodents.

Food hygiene training to be encouraged.

### Lone working

Anyone using the building, not for a regular meeting, to sign in and out on the notice board in the Sydenham Road entrance lobby.
